

**PROCLAMATION AND ORDER ISSUING PHASED GUIDELINES
TO REOPEN BUSINESSES AND LIFT COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS
ISSUED PURSUANT TO CITY OF GLENPOOL RESOLUTION 2020003:**

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the coronavirus COVID-19 disease to be a pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020 the President of the United States declared a National Emergency; due to the COVID-19 Virus pandemic and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2020, the Governor of the State of Oklahoma declared an emergency caused by the impending threat of COVID-19 to the people of this State and the public's peace, health and safety; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, the Governor of the State of Oklahoma issued a "Safer at Home" order that has been amended and expanded through May 6, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Title 11 Ok. Stat 22-120 gives a municipal governing body authority to enact and enforce such ordinances, rules, and regulations as it deems necessary for the protection of the public health that are not inconsistent with state law, and specifically states that a governing body may make regulations to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases into a municipality; and

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2020, the City Council met in a Regular Meeting and approved Resolution 2020003 declaring a state of emergency exists within the City of Glenpool and authorizing the Mayor to direct the City Manager to take such emergency actions as are consistent with this emergency; and

WHEREAS, On March 20, 2020, the Mayor of the City of Glenpool, as authorized by Resolution No. 2020002 issued a Proclamation and Order Limiting and Closing Certain Commercial Businesses Issued Pursuant to City of Glenpool Resolution 2020002; and

WHEREAS, On April 1, 2020, the Mayor of the City of Glenpool, as authorized by Resolution No. 2020003 issued a Proclamation and Order to Require Residents to Shelter at Home Issued Pursuant to City of Glenpool Resolution 2020003; and

WHEREAS, on April 22, 2020, the Governor issued his Open Up and Recover Safely Plan that is based on scientific modeling from public health experts and is designed to mitigate the risk of the resurgence of COVID-19.


NOW THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO CIVIL EMERGENCY AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME, IT IS HEREBY DECLARED AND ORDERED, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Proclamation and Orders issued by the Mayor on March 20, 2020, and April 1, 2020, shall be superseded by this order.
2. The City hereby adopts the plans outlined in the Governor's Open Up and Recover Safely

Plan under the following guidelines:


- a. Residents over the age of 65 or who are members of a vulnerable population should continue to follow the State of Oklahoma's "Safer at Home" guidelines.
 - b. Personal Care businesses may open Friday, April 24, 2020 pursuant to the guidelines contained in the "Open Up and Recover Safely Plan".
 - c. Phase 1 guidelines will begin May 1, 2020; however, the City recommends following the 10-person rule for gatherings as outlined in the President's Opening Up America Again Guidelines.
 - d. Phase 2 guidelines will begin as announced by the Governor; however, the City recommends following the 50-person rule for gatherings as outlined in the President's Opening Up America Again Guidelines.
 - e. Phase 3 guidelines will begin as announced by the Governor.
3. All businesses, as much as possible, shall comply with social distancing requirements, including but not limited to maintaining six feet of physical distancing, or the most current Center for Disease Control (CDC) or Tulsa Health Department recommendations, for both employees and the general public;
 4. The use of any playground equipment within City Parks is prohibited, even if not locked, gated, fenced, or cordoned off. All neighborhoods with neighborhood-owned playground equipment or shelters are strongly encouraged to comply with guidelines herein for City Parks;
 5. The Black Gold Park Splash Pad is hereby closed, and the water shall remain turned off until further notice;
 6. When engaging in activity outside the residence, individuals, except those from the same residence, to the greatest extent feasible, should continue to comply with social distancing requirements, including but not limited to maintaining six feet of physical distancing or the most current Center for Disease Control (CDC) or Tulsa Health Department recommendations;
 7. This Order shall take effect April 24, 2020, at 12:01 AM.
