As you review the following departmental reports, I hope you take notice of the number of different projects that have been completed or are in progress. Allow me to take a moment and highlight a few that are in the report and add a few others that I believe are informative.

- The City and its two major trust authorities (GUSA and GIA) all realized positive fund balance increases as of the end of June.
- I am pleased to report that outside of two police officers (of which candidates are currently undergoing final background and compliance checks) and three seasonal workers in Streets and Parks, we have finally been able to catch up with our large number of vacancies we carried for much of the last year.
- The Hwy 75 Project continues to progress at a steady pace. Staff were recently able to get a tour of the project with ODOT representatives, and we are told the highway mainline could be open sometime in August with work transitioning to the frontage roads. The expectation is still that the project will be completed in October.
- City facilities will be receiving an upgraded phone system and security system over the next few months. Currently we have several different phone systems in place across the City that don't allow us to have seamless transitions from building to building. Additionally, technology has increased significantly since our last phone system (Conference Center/City Hall) was installed 15 years ago. The security system will likewise tie multiple systems into a single cohesive program and will allow us greater control over our building security.

- As part of our core value of “Always be truthful and transparent”, our staff is always looking for new opportunities to communicate with the public. We recently started two new programs to increase this transparency.
 - First, we have implemented a quarterly newsletter that will be attached to the water bills for all our customers. This inaugural newsletter was attached to our June billing. We are striving to keep this newsletter to a single page that prints with the bill, but we hope our customers find the information helpful.
 - Secondly, we implemented a new monthly video series today. It is called Glenpool Gives Back. This series is about highlighting business, non-profits, and individuals who are improving people’s lives through their acts of service across the city. Our first video highlighted one of our community treasurers, Gayla Seaton with Mercy Mission II. I am so thankful for the many people like Gayla and Mercy Mission II that work so diligently to lend a helping hand and improve this city.
- Upcoming Community Events/City Holidays:
 - Labor Day: September 1st

In closing, and on behalf of our Executive Team and the broader City of Glenpool Family, I want to say, “Thank You!” to all of you who volunteer your time serving on the City Council. We are all very grateful for the support and respect you show to each of us. It is only through this successful partnership that we are able to accomplish the beneficial and needed projects happening across this community.

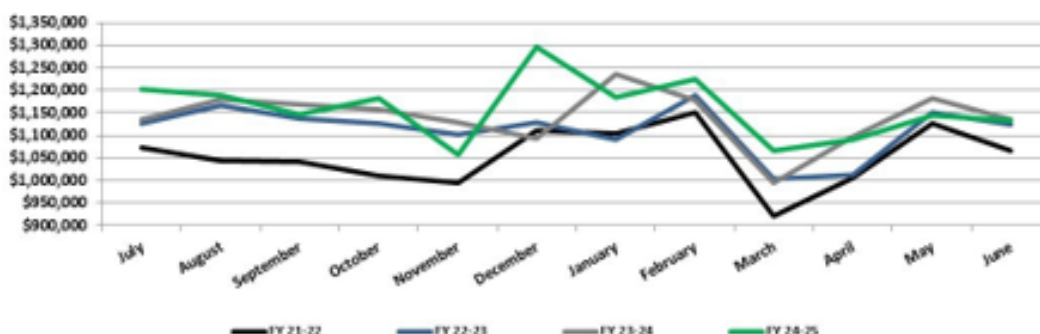

GENERAL FUND REVENUES

FY 24-25 General Fund revenues through May totaled \$15,286,518, which is \$180,569, or 1.2%, higher than FY 23-24 revenues for the same period. Year-to-date revenues are \$417,642 above [budget](#), with Sales Tax, Investment Income, Intergovernmental, and Miscellaneous revenues all up.



GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES

FY 24-25 General Fund [expenditures](#) through May totaled \$13,904,570, or \$242,161 (1.8%) higher than FY 23-24 expenditures through the same [period](#). These expenditures were 10.7% under budget year-to-date.

SALES TAX REVENUES—ALL FUNDS



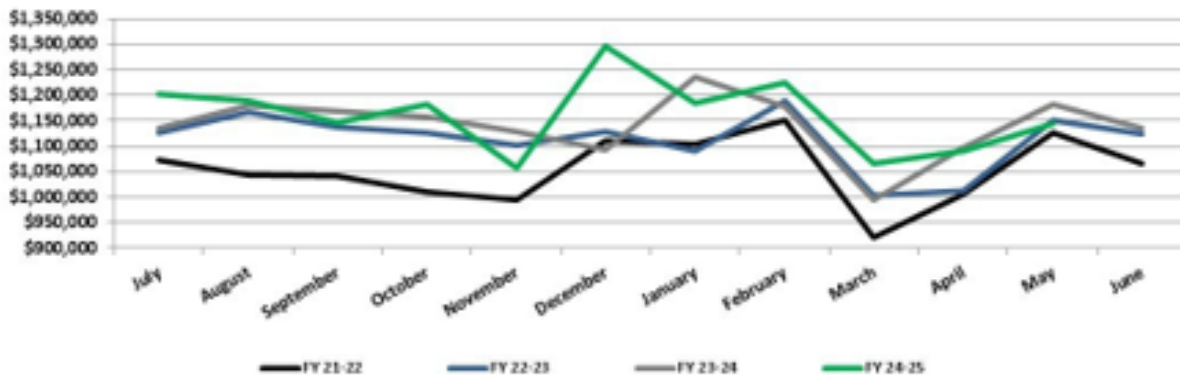
FY24-25 year-to-date Sales Tax collections through May were 0.9% above budget, and 1.8% higher than FY23-24 collections for the same period.

FY 24-25 Actual Compared to Previous 3 Fiscal Years Actual

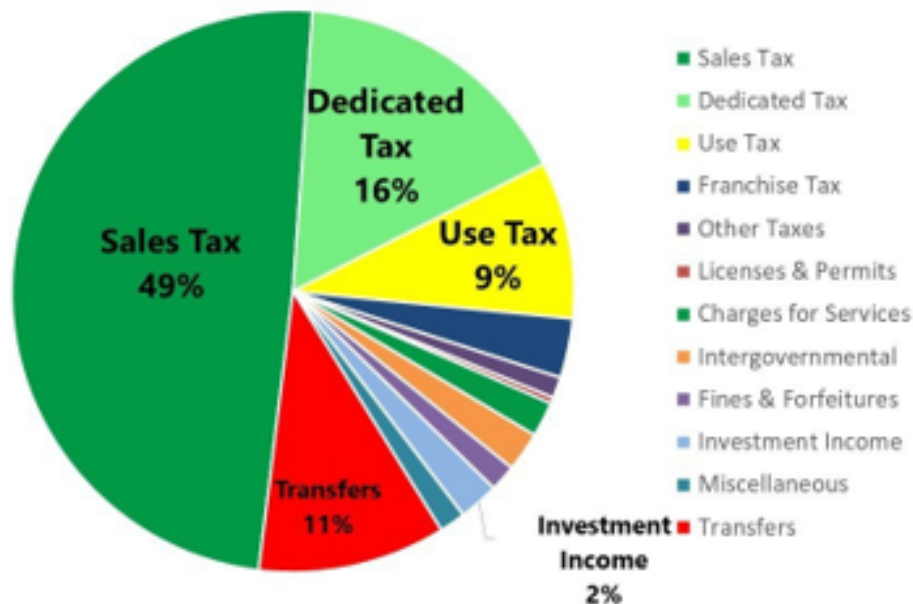

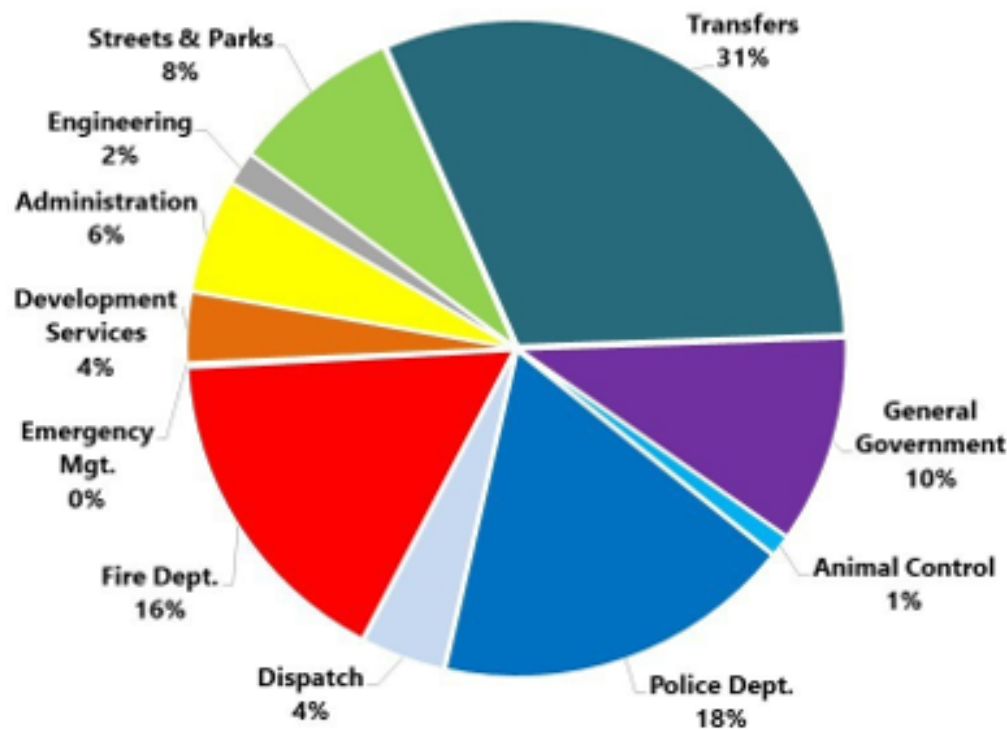

General Fund YTD Percent Expenditures by Department



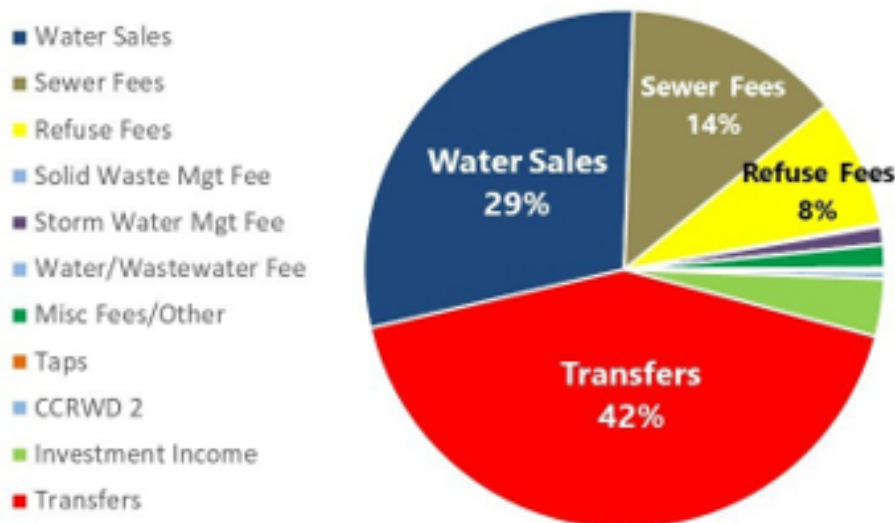

GUSA YTD Revenues by Type

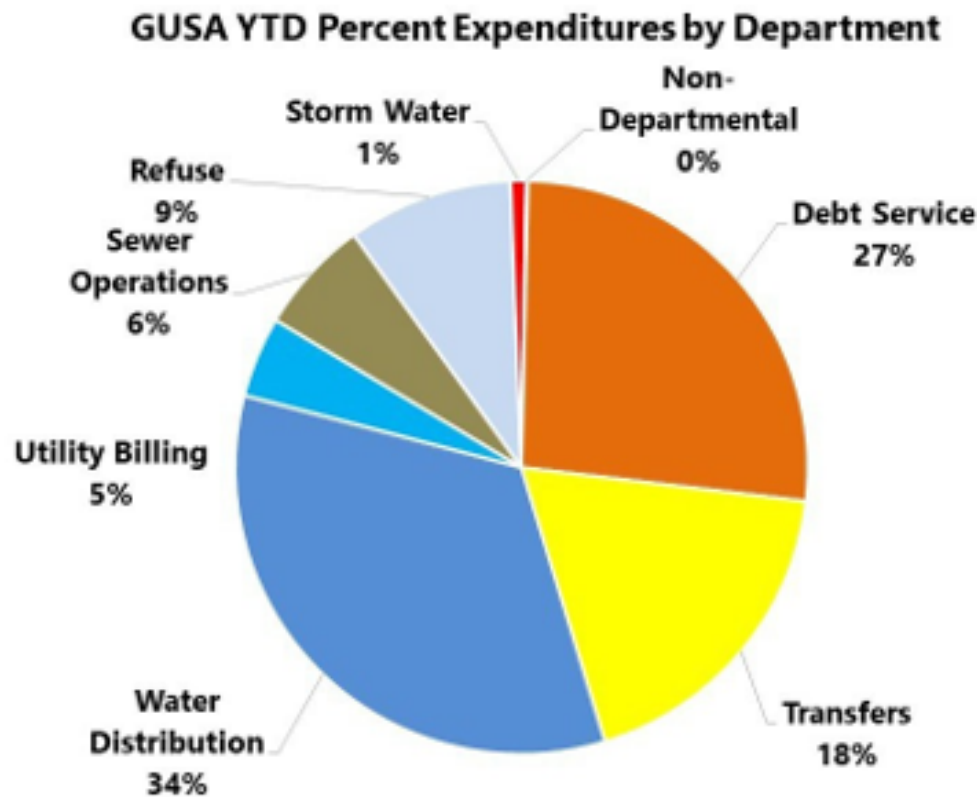

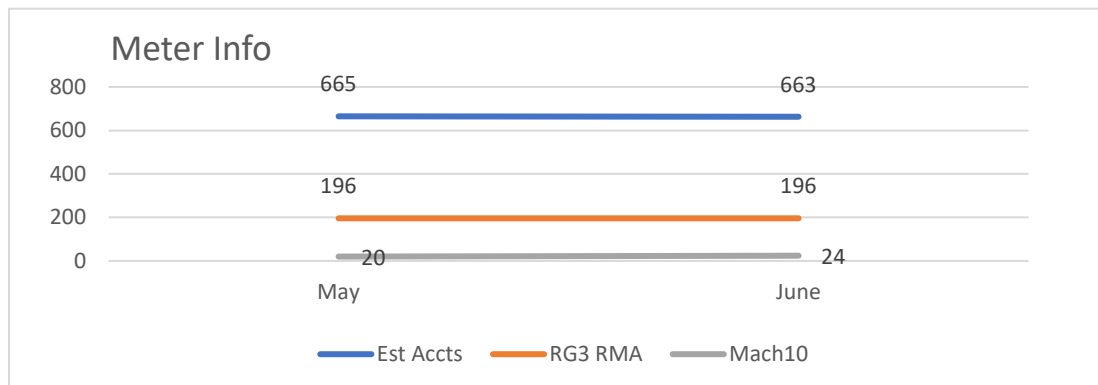
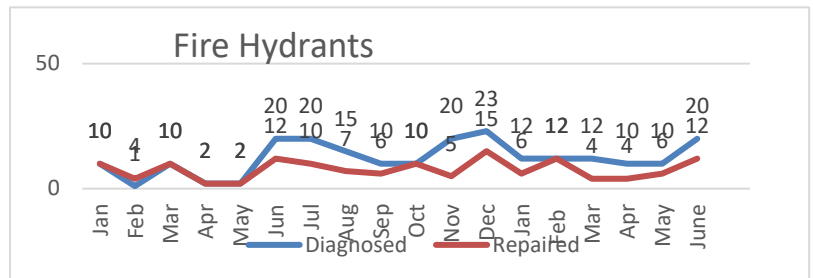
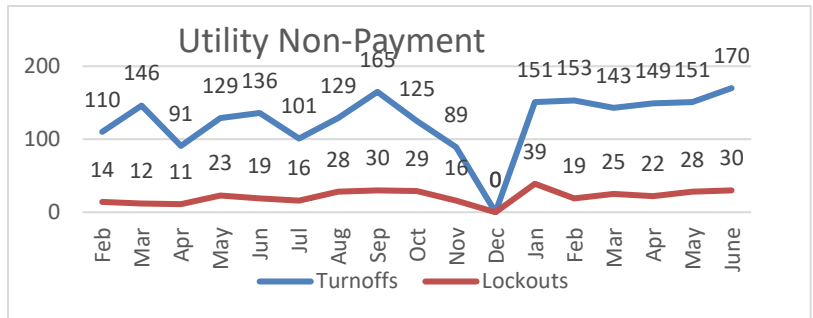
Lift Stations:

- 30 lock outs for non-payment – (6/26)

- Bi-weekly water samples taken and FAILED. Retake Failed. Poison Oak could be culprit. Waiting on DEQ as to procedure to move forward. Samples up and downstream PASSED
- Mowed, weeded, and sprayed (where needed) at water towers and booster stations
- Cleaned and serviced vehicles and equipment
- Repaired 1 Sewer Manholes
- Jet rodded 2 possible sewer backup(s) (1 on city side, 1 on customer side)
- Diagnosed 20 hydrants, put 12 back in service and ordered parts for all others.
- Booster Pump station on US75 at 131st has had its pin hole leak temporarily repaired. The station is now mostly isolated from distribution. Awaiting further instruction from the city engineer on a path forward.
- Elwood Lift Station has demonstrated that it cannot keep up with flow during rain events. We have purchased a used bypass pump to use here whenever it rains.



WWTF Build - UPDATE

Work continues at full force. The south digester has three of the four walls up and the north digester has rebar on all sides. The foundation for the administration building is prepped and ready to be poured. The dewatering building foundation has been started. The UV foundation is close to completion. The rebar for the foundation of the SBR has started. Additionally, Crossland's workshop (the roof can be seen in several photos, has been erected and is in use.



Disc Golf Course - UPDATE

The area designated for the parking lot at Morris Park was cleared. This clears the way for a parking lot to be created as funds become available



Manhole Repair at 121st and Waco

The manhole at the south east corner of the QuikTrip property on 121st had failed, with multiple chunks of concrete popping out of place. Three quotes were received and 3 Angels was selected to do the work. The project took two days with two more days for curing.



Library Water Main Repair

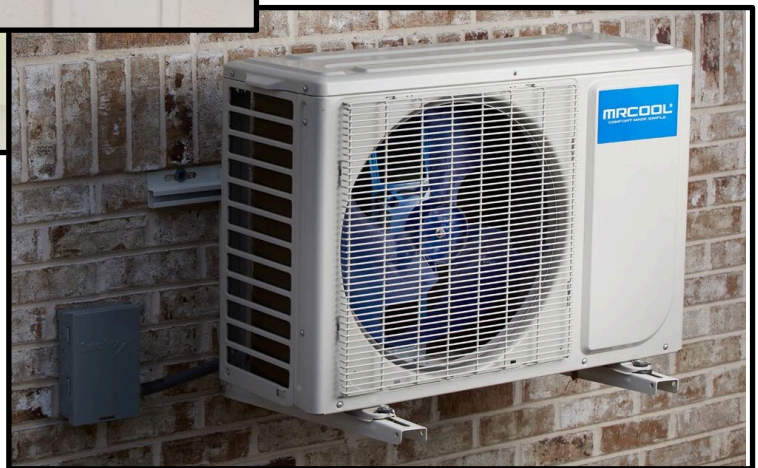
A plumber was working on some issues at the Glenpool Library and noticed that the shut off valve at the meter was no longer functional. After some back and forth, it was decided that we would replace that entire feed for the building and bring the plumbing current to this century. City water operators removed a 2" Neptune manual read meter and an ABB 5/8" manual read meter. After completion the library has two brand new Neptune Mach10 meters with new fittings, piping and most importantly, a new shutoff.

This type of transition will be happening as often as we can manage to purge our system of the manual read meters in an effort to read more efficiently and better track usage throughout the city.



Concession Stand A/C Install

After many years of faithful and marginal service, the window unit at the concession stand at Black Gold finally died. The option to replace with a similar unit that made the same noise and offered the same output wasn't very appealing, so staff decided that a mini split installation was the best option. After installation the tenant can barely hear the unit run and no matter what the outside temperature is, the room sits at the desired temperature



Blue Thumb Creek Mini Adventure

For the second year in a row, Blue Thumb (a program of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission), has organized a creek walk for interested individuals to come explore the life in Coal Creek @ Morris Park.

Glenpool Safe Route to School Project JP#3810404

The project establishes an ADA-compliant sidewalk network linking Glenpool Public School to Black Gold Park.

- Total cost: \$1,202,760 (City match: \$240,552 - paid).

Elwood Ave. Widening from 151st – 137th Street, State JP#36939(05)

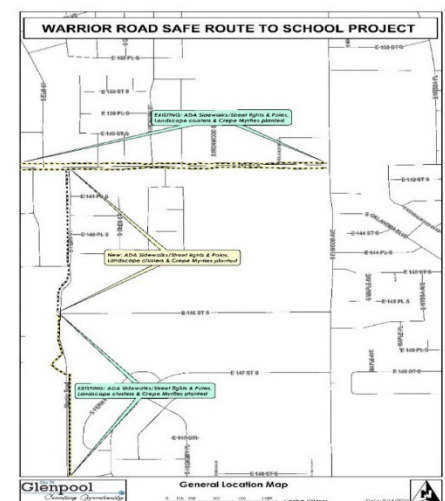

TAP Grant Sidewalk Improvement Project on Warrior Road. JP#3802804

Sidewalk & Beautification Phase II Project JP#28845(05)

Construction of 2 miles of sidewalks linking Glenpool School to the Glenpool Community Center along 146th street, Elwood Avenue, 141st street and Peoria Ave. Project includes installing decorative lighting along 141st street.

- Final plans and estimates received; under final review with ODOT.
- Transportation grant: \$550,800 (City match: \$137,700).
- Additional funding needed; applied for 2024 INCOG TAP grant.

This project was recommended to receive Transportation Alternatives Program grant by the INCOG Transportation Technical Committee. The grant award is \$1,500,974 in Federal Funds. Received the agreement for the grant. The agreement shall be presented to the Council at the June 2nd Council Meeting. **Bid letting scheduled for September 2025.**

US 75/141st Bridge Project

This project constructs a bridge on US-75 over 141st Street, providing frontage roads and signalization.

- Estimated duration: 315 days.
- Project cost: \$27.5M; lowest bid: \$31.4M (Sherwood Construction Co.).
- Currently under construction.



Stormwater Management

- DEQ conducted a routine MS4 compliance inspection on June 11th to review the City's stormwater practices and documentation. The engineering team attended. Site visits included the Public Works building, Redbud Glen, Mammoth luxury garage, and the WWTP. DEQ recommended updating the City's SWMP to reflect recent infrastructure improvements and emphasized the need for staff training on dry weather testing and illicit discharge response.
- EPA will be conducting a community Compliance Evaluation Inspection on our MS4 program from July 28 -31st 2025.
- Issued two (2) Notice of Violations (NOVs) to developers for erosion control violations at active construction sites within the City.
- Complied and resubmitted the DEQ Annual Report for the 2024 calendar year. The report included updates on our Stormwater activities, compliance and community outreach activities.

Rolling Meadows Stormwater This project aims to address surface water runoff issues affecting residents of Rolling Meadows near Taylor’s Pond Subdivision.

- Crafton, Tull & Associates are engineers for design (30% of design plans are received).

Community Development Block Grant

- FY2024 grant: \$120,143 for Glen Village Addition II improvements (stormwater, sinkhole, and street repairs).
- Next step: Develop design and specifications.

Bicycle/ Pedestrian Masterplan Update

This is an update to the City of Glenpool’s Bicycle and Pedestrian plan, which would become part of the INCOG Regional Go Masterplan. The city entered into an agreement with INCOG on February 21st, 2024, to update the city bicycle/pedestrian plan. The selected consultant is RDG-Garver LLC.

- Project is underway.

Road Maintenance Project

- The bid for the City of Glenpool Micro surfacing and Crack Sealing project was advertised on April 10th, 2025. The Bids are due May 1st, 2025. **This bid was rejected. Staff will reprogram several maintenance projects to be bid on a future date.**
- Preparing an RFQ for storm drain and sinkhole repairs on Longhorn Avenue

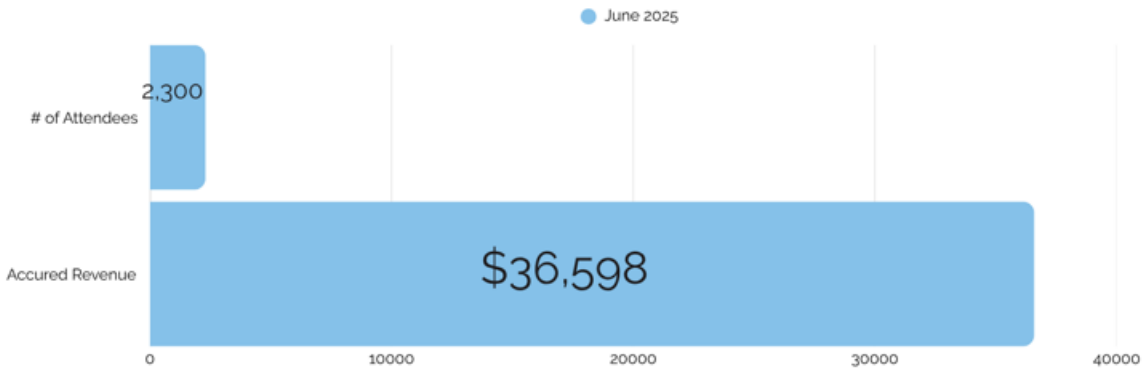
EVENTS TO HIGHLIGHT

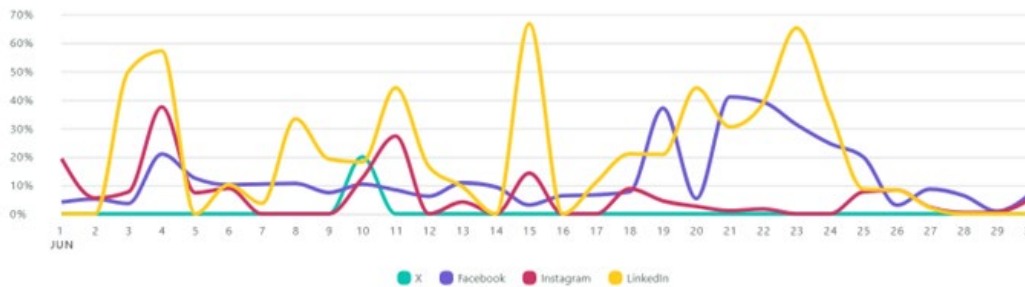

Phone System Update

The final steps to new 3CX phone system are currently in the works, and we will be working with BTC (current vendor) to port all phone numbers on Wednesday, June 4th. Training will take place two days prior to cutover. The new phone system has many features that will improve phone performance for all employees. It will also give us the ability to make/update changes in-house. These additional features will also make incoming calls to the City of Glenpool an improved experience and anticipate less hold times and call routing improvements.

After a quick vacation trip, I will be working with our current IT Vendor and new phone vendor to make updates to the switches for the project

Cyber-Security Grant

IT is collaborating with Police Chief Jeremy Plane to replace critical antiquated hardware and repurpose old server for back-up storage. **The new server that was awarded with a Cyber-Security grant has been installed and operational. Old server will be repurposed for storing backups.**

Security System Upgrade

IT will also be working alongside the police to update our current security cameras and access control system. This will enhance the current system and make management easier across a single platform. **This is an ongoing project, and we will be meeting with vendors this week for an update.**

Future Projects

IT department is also working on evaluating the current software provider and seeing what departments' needs that are/aren't being met. There are many areas within our current provider that need improvement.

Website Redesign

I am currently working on updates to our current City of Glenpool website and will begin working with Civic Plus on entire website refresh beginning in July.

The Glenpool Economic Development Team is a newly formed, collaborative team focused on strengthening relationships with local businesses and supporting long-term economic growth. Our purpose is to conduct regular outreach, identify business needs, and connect employers with helpful resources through a formal Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) program. Committee members, made up of local, regional, and state partners, will meet monthly and conduct structured business visits to listen, learn, and provide support. In June, our team received training from Charlotte Howe with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, who guided us through best practices in BRE, including interview techniques, confidentiality, and strategies for building lasting business partnerships.




Commerce Incentives

New Business/Sites

- Housing Study – Proposals Under Review: We are currently evaluating proposals to conduct a Comprehensive Housing Study for Glenpool. Proposals under consideration include a range of deliverables such as digital reports, online dashboards, stakeholder engagement, and public surveys. The selected study will help guide future housing strategies in response to Glenpool's continued growth.
- Contacted by a building owner preparing to sell; I was able to connect him with a prospective business owner in need of a building or property.
- Contacted about a property south of 161st; met with a prospective owner to discuss zoning questions and explore potential uses that would be a good fit for the site.
- Contacted by a commercial developer whose company recently purchased land in Glenpool; provided Glenpool-specific data including traffic counts, housing starts, and economic development indicators. We're working to schedule a meeting with him and the property owner to discuss project specifics.
- In a follow-up meeting with the new manager of Glenpool company, we discussed site expansion needs and the role of the Economic Development team. We will be scheduling a visit and connecting him with school contacts to explore partnership opportunities. RFP (Request for Proposal) Submissions. We received 45 RFPs through "Tulsa's Future" in 2025 and submitted 4.

- 2024 STBG street widening grant (for Elwood) was awarded last year by ODOT. The signed contract was received on 1/7/2025 and on 1/13/25, David A. met with developers. Awaiting bid process as of 6/26/2026.
- INCOG CDBG Grant approved on 12/2/2024 to repair sinkhole at 145th and Kendalwood BLVD. Signatures were received from City and from County on 2/14/2025. The scope of the project changed in April, and an extension is set for signatures at the next council meeting on July 7th.
- Oklahoma Homeland Security State and Local Cybersecurity Program grant was approved on 12/20/24. Able to replace the server with the PD. Terms and conditions signed on 4/21/2025. Debra Wood is in the process of equipment purchase as of 6/26/2028. Awaiting purchase order and copy of payment to be sent for reimbursement.
- FY 2025-2026 Transportation Alternatives & FY 2022-2026 CRP. up to \$1,600,000 (20% matching), Application in collaboration with David A. was submitted on 1/13/25, for completing sidewalk projects on Elwood and 141st, and Peoria Ave. Approved on 3/19/2025. As of 6/26/2025 David A. is working on the bid process.
- Recreational Trails Program Grant 2025: 80% reimbursed up to \$300,000, with a total amount of \$375,000. This is for trails/parking lot/bridges at the new Morris Park Disc Golf and Nature Trails Park. Approvals to be sent out by June 30th.

- Opioid Grant 2025: Application submitted June 13th in the amount of \$203,303.26 in collaboration with Mercy Regional EMS for a First Watch System benefiting 6 counties.
- DEQ - Collection Event Grant FY26: Application submitted February 28, 2025. Application approved on 4/14/2025 with an unspecified amount. They were unsure if we would be able to get the full amount of our request. We DID end up getting the full amount after all and they sent the contract to be signed at the next council meeting on July 7th.
- SAFE Oklahoma Grant: \$59,544.30 with one more addition as soon as I receive the invoice. This will be for a drone and a UAV (drone), and an ATV. Applications are due July 25th. This is set to be on the next council agenda for approval July 7th.
- Keep Oklahoma Beautiful Roadside and Environmental Beautification grants were approved in the amount of \$3700 on 2/26/2025, and check received 3/7/2025. Emily, Landscape Manager, has started the projects as of 6/26/25 but are not completed. We will need to send pictures after completion. This is the last requirement to fulfill the grant.

The Glenpool Shelter also joined us for an adoption event. We had 51 booths and attractions, and it was a great hit for the community.

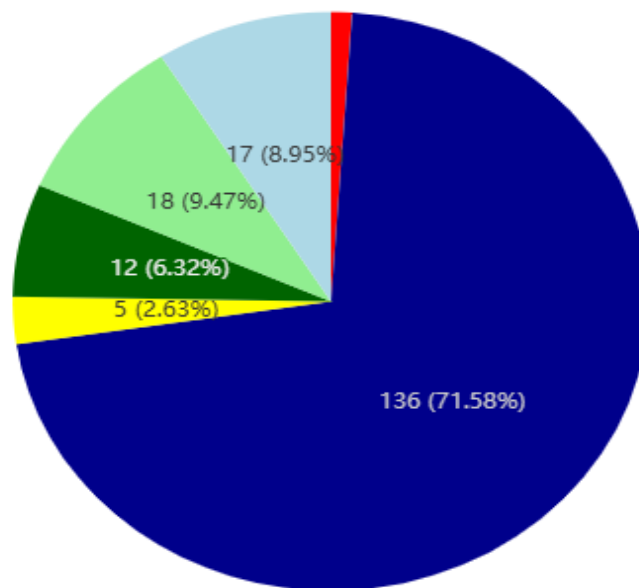
