



## Winter Updates from the City

### Elwood Widening Project

The City of Glenpool is making significant progress on the Elwood Avenue Widening Project, an important transportation and safety initiative designed to improve mobility, reduce congestion, and create safer travel routes for pedestrians, bicyclists, schoolchildren, and motorists. This long-planned improvement spans 1.41 miles, beginning at 151st Street and continuing north to 137th Street, and will include roadway widening, safety enhancements, and new pedestrian and trail infrastructure.



The Elwood Avenue Widening Project is a key component of the Move Glenpool Forward plan approved by voters in 2016. To support the project, the City secured a Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) specifically for engineering and design work, helping advance this major community investment.

Once completed, the Elwood Avenue Widening Project will support smoother traffic flow, improved walkability, and enhanced safety—helping Glenpool continue its momentum as a growing, connected, and accessible community.

### Sidewalk Expansion & Beautification Project

The City of Glenpool is advancing the Sidewalk Expansion and Beautification Project, an effort to improve safety, accessibility, and the visual appeal of key corridors. Supported by a TAP grant and let by ODOT in November 2025, the project is expected to begin construction in 2026. Improvements include ADA-compliant sidewalks, decorative lighting, landscaping, and safer pedestrian routes connecting major destinations such as the South County Recreation Center.

The project includes sidewalk additions along 141st Street, Peoria Avenue, and 146th Street, enhancing walkability and strengthening community connectivity.
